


# How to upgrade TP-LINK wired Powerline Adapter


## Notice:

- **Please verify the hardware version of your device so as to download the right firmware version. Wrong firmware upgrading may damage your device and void the warranty.**



- **After you downloaded the firmware from TP-LINK website, please use decompression software such as WinZIP or WinRAR to extract the firmware file to a folder;**
- **Please download the latest Powerline Utility from TP-LINK website (you can also find it in the packaged CD), then use decompression software such as WinZIP or WinRAR to extract the firmware file to a folder;**
- **Do NOT turn off the power or cut down the Ethernet cable during upgrade process.**

**Step 1:** Plug your computer into the Powerline adapter with Ethernet cable. Run the CD and install the Utility (you can also download the latest utility from TP-LINK website). Run it and you will see the **"Upgrade Firmware"** button in **System** tab.




**Step 2:** Click **Upgrade Firmware**. Click **Browse** and select the related **NVM** file from the download folder.




**Step 3:** Click **Browse** again a select the related **PIB** file from download folder.



**Step 4:** Click **OK** and wait a moment until it finished.



**Step 5:** Check the firmware version in **Status** tab to see whether it's been successfully upgraded.



**Step 6:** After upgrading, you should pair your Powerline adapters to build the Powerline network again.
